Clean Water and Natural Lands Advisory Commission Seeks Applicants

Did you know that one half of one percent of all Real Property Taxes goes to a fund to provide for the purchase of land for land conservation? It's called the Clean Water and Natural Lands Fund (CWNLF). There is the Clean Water and Natural Lands Advisory Commission that meets once a month to consider applications to fund new parks, protect watersheds, preserve natural lands, protect historic or culturally important sites, and acquire of public access to public land and open space. The Commission considers proposals submitted to it by agencies or non-profit organizations and then makes recommendations to the Council for approval of expenditures from the Clean Water and Natural Lands Fund. \$11.7 million is available in this fiscal year.

On August 7, the Honolulu City Council approved Resolution 19-158, CD1 to authorize expenditure of the CWNLF to acquire three parcels along the Pearl Harbor Historic Trail (PHHT) to form the new Pearlridge Neighborhood Park. This parcel is directly behind the Kalauao (Pearlridge) Rail Station and will provide a passive park for the community users of the PHHT. My staff and I have been working on this park acquisition for nearly five years, and we are excited to see the funding for more greenspace for everyone to enjoy.
